Bringing an aircraft and/or small ship into Aotearoa New Zealand as a private individual



About this form

There are conditions under the Working Tariff Part II Concession Reference 80 that you, as the owner of the aircraft and/or small ship, must meet. Use this form to declare that you undertake to meet these conditions. This form **must** be signed by the owner of the aircraft and/or small ship.

This form should be used for, but not limited to, helicopters, aeroplanes, gliders, microlight aircraft, motor boats, yachts and jet skis.

You can complete this form by saving a copy to your computer. Information you have filled in can be saved as you go so you do not have to complete it in one session.

If you are completing this form on your computer, you can sign using an electronic signature or by typing your name.

I will immediately pay to Customs the charges that would have applied if duty were levied on the goods at the time of their importation, under Part 1 of the Tariff, or any lesser sum that may be required.

Return this signed and completed form to the agency processing your clearance. This could be a customs broker/ shipping agent, freight forwarder or New Zealand Customs.

How Customs collects and uses your information
